- 3. Jingo: You may not know it, but the National Anthem is 'Nigeria we Hail Thee'. It was composed by an ugly and hungry teacher and this suggested that he wanted fame. He made a revolution in Nigeria by providing the wording and changed the morale of Nigerians Bongo: What? Stop fooling yourself. The National Anthem is 'Arise O Compatriots'. It was written by a nurse who was not ugly but comfortable and this does not mean he wants any popularity. There have been no radical political and economic changes in the country and the country is daily witnessing breakdown of values.
- 4. Jingo: A tree that fell in the bush in the dead of the night when no human being was present will not make any noise. A scholar that says it will make noise is not well grounded and it shows that such a person has not been schooled in science. In fact, he is a fool.

 Jingo: This is serious! When no one is present in the bush, a fallen tree will make no noise. Anyone who says so is efficiently grounded and is efficiently qualified, but depending on what you mean by science. Notwithstanding all of these, it is immoral to call someone a fool.
