- 1. Mr James a member of the Medical and Dental Practitioners Associations of Bagauda has been a torn in the flesh of the officials of the union. He recently accused the officials of the Union of perpetuating fraud against the Union, utilizing the union fund to fund political parties, and using union funds to defend a lawsuit challenging the election of the union president. In response to these allegations, the union officials wrote Mr James alleging that these acts were sanctioned by the majority of members of the Union. Mr James is aggrieved and is thinking of challenging the actions of the Union official in court. Advise him.
- 2. The fact that workers could come together to negotiate better conditions of employment, is a step in the right direction. However, the outcome of such negotiations depends on a number of factors. Discuss the importance of collective bargaining as well as the various factors that enhance the process.
- With the aid of statutory and judicial authorities to compare and contrast the salient provisions of Workmen Compensation Act and Employees Compensation Act in relation to compensation for injuries.
