

# Rev. John S. McGee: Miscellaneous Writings

(Compiled by John David McGee, September, 2023; Revised, July, 2024,  
with typed transcriptions)

**NOTE:** This volume, originally consisting mainly of my father’s hand-written notes, during his retirement years (1978-99) in North Carolina, has been “revised” to include my typed transcriptions of his difficult-to-read script. It seemed that this was necessary to ensure much value of the material to others. In doing so, I have inserted (*in bold; italicized*) comments to assist in understanding his very brief notes. My own (SBTS) seminary-training background, and knowing my father as I do, has been helpful in this regard.

The notes came from several notebooks and small binders which my dad used over the years, for the Sunday School lessons which he taught; services of various sorts which he conducted; occasional personal letters and other memorabilia, which will help “introduce” him to the readers.

The original documents, along with all the other McGee Family materials, are in permanent archive at **Duke University, Rubenstein Library of Rare Books and Special Collections**, where other SBC missionaries to Nigeria, also have made donation with their materials relating to the “History of the Baptist Mission to Nigeria, 1850-2000).”
