He lived alone for 5 years without any other wife. After 8 years, Dr. Alao married former Miss Nigeria according to the Kalabari native law and customs. In year 2014, Dr. Alao died without a Will. Tosin had 5 children and the former Miss Nigeria had a child for Dr. Alao. Mrs. Tosin Alao stated that she and all the children, including the one had for Dr. Alao by the former Miss Nigeria are exclusively entitled to the Estate of Dr. Alao, while the former Miss Nigeria said she and her child are exclusively entitled to Dr. Alao's estate as she is the legal wife living with the deceased at the time of his demise.

Advise the parties. Would your answer be different if there was a legal separation between Dr. Alao and his first wife?
