Section A: CONTEXT QUESTIONS.

Comment on Any Two of the following gobbets (15 marks each)

- 1. "In October 1840, after a long, long period of seeking, I obtained hope in Christ and soon after, was baptized in the name of the adorable trinity. My happiness in those days was more than language can express"
 - (T.J. Bowen, Adventures and Missionary Labors, 1856)
- 2. "I did not recognize it [Ijaye] again, although, I had been there twice before. Oh what a desolation! The houses burnt and broken down, nothing remaining but the naked walls, partly fallen down, partly washed down by the heavy rains; the whole town overgrown with bush, thorns and briars; a small single footpath leading from one end so the other... I never saw the work of destruction to (so?) complete. Oh, my heart bled when remembering the trials, hardships, anxieties of God's servants in this town, how little effect their preaching made, and how now the whole population of between 60,000 and 70,000 is scattered over the whole land in bondage, or without home, and how many died by the sword, how many by famine... Our station, dwelling house, and church, are now a heap of ruins – a perfect wilderness, and so is the station of the Baptists" Church Missionary Intelligencer, 1863, p. 92
- 3. One ... apparent difficulty in the way of Native church-work in Africa, without which it would be an easier task to attack the strongholds of Satan and reap large harvest of souls is Mohammedanism....The Native churches in West Africa have only the Mohammedan for their antagonists in the field of labour. (Mojola Agbebi, in *Africa and the Gospel*, p.11)
- 4. "This was apparently a heavy blow to our mission, not only in Lagos, but in the whole country. But that which in the eyes of men is a calamity is often used of God for the extension of His Kingdom; and thus it proved in this case. This was the beginning of a movement that spread over the whole country, including the other denominations who suffered more than we; for our people continued true to the doctrine of the Baptists, and we were eventually reunited in the convention some years later".
